Announcing Dawson Reunion 2014


August 30 & 31

Dawson mine disaster memorialized in Raton

Plaque

Oct. 22, 1913, and again 10 years later on Feb. 8, 1923, life changed for the mining families of Dawson. Stag Canyon Mine No. 2, owned by the Phelps Dodge Corporation, had an explosion that rocked a two-mile radius around Dawson.

263 miners died in the 1913 accident. The newspaper reported that most of them were immigrants — 129 from Italy, 52 from Greece, 30 from Mexico and the rest from Austria, France, England, Russia and other countries, along with 37 English-speaking Americans, both whites and blacks.

All that is left of Dawson today is a cemetery laden with iron crosses from those who died in the two mining accidents.

Now considered one of many New Mexico ghost towns, Dawson is reawakened 100 years later in memory. In an official proclamation, Gov. Susana Martinez declared Oct. 22 as "Dawson Remembrance Day". New Mexico Director of Historic Sites, Richard Sims, presented the official plaque to Dawson Association Committee Chairman, Joe Bacca.

"It was the second largest explosion in the United States up to today." The cemetery is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Sims explained. Nearly 50 people, many of whom are decedents of Dawson miners and former residents of the town, gathered at the Raton Museum on Sunday to witness the presentation of the governor's proclamation and an aluminum plaque that will be placed at the Dawson Cemetery next year during the Dawson Association reunion set for Labor Day weekend in 2014. Also attending the Sunday memorial proclamation service at the Raton Museum was Italian Consulate representative Irene Buongiorno of Los Angeles, Claudio Ruben of Red Lotus film production in Santa Fe, along with Italian film director Fulvio Ottaviano, who plans on making a documentary of Dawson and its Italian immigrants who shaped the mining town and ultimately the northern region of New Mexico.

Dawson anniversary

Due to having the picnic on even years, we will be celebrating in the honor of those that lost their live's in the 1913 mine explosion.

On Sunday October 20, 2013, honors coalition from the AHEPA Chapter 501 of Albuquerque and St. Elias The Prophet Church of Santa FE planned a 100th year anniversary "Day of Remembrance" for all those who perished in the mine explosions in Dawson in 1913 & 1923. On Sunday, October 27, 2013, religious leaders from various faiths, conducted a grave side memorial service in Dawson. Following the service, a reading of all 350 miners names from 1913 & 1923 explosions were read.
